For those of you who are not a part of our family, and this sounds like something you would like to be a part of please give me a call. Our classes are January, April, July, & October. Join Us!



Mechanical Restoration



Our Mechanical Restoration Team continues to amaze me with their creativity, hard work. and can-do attitude, resulting in great progress with our various projects and challenges around the Park and in our workshop.

Recently we reconfigured the items in the open barn providing additional space for any future needs. This was a team effort with Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District. Robert Mendez and his team used their equipment along with Simi Valley Historical Society volunteers to complete the work.

Our Cat 22 project is progressing nicely. The radiator is ready to reassemble, the engine block water jacket flushed,

oil pan reinstalled, and some sheet metal items have been prepared for prime and paint. The gas tank needs repair. We have been discussing the best way to accomplish this task. A decision will be made in the upcoming weeks.

In preparation for our History Day Event on Saturday, June 25 2016, we will be busy the next few Mondays with clean up and maintenance of our two Model T Fords, our refurbished tractors, stationary engines, and related equipment.

The Model A Engine Gordon Smith air compressor has been moved from open barn into the workshop for the evaluation and baseline needed for refurbishment Once completed, the goal is to attach the air compressor behind the Cat 22 Tractor, as a unit for demonstration and a teaching aid for park tours.



We have a work session each Monday at the Park, 9AM - 12 Noon, please come by, give a look, and lend a hand or two. You do not need to be a expert mechanic, just have a willingness to volunteer, meet some great people, and give back to your community.

A Beloved Friend Who Will be Missed So Much

Merry Lynn McLaren passed away on March 23rd, 2016. She joined our volunteer family in 2003 after retiring from teaching in Simi Valley Elementary Schools for 34 years. Just because she retired from teaching in schools didn't mean she stopped teaching. She was a devoted member of our School Tour team, teaching children about the Chumash People and about Simi History. She also led tours around the Park and taught anyone who wanted to learn about Simi History. She even trained others who wanted to be volunteer docents at the Park. She was always enthusiastic, very dedicated, and could always be counted on. Merry Lynn's absence is felt very deeply at Strathearn Park. She is, and will be missed by all.





In this informative installment of HISTORY POLICE we will briefly explore the history of Strathearn Historical Park and Museum.

We'll begin the story during the Spanish land grant, or mission era. Santiago Pico de la Cruz, who was a common soldier with the Anza Expedition (1775-1776) retired in 1786 and asked for the Rancho Simí land grant. He was granted permission by the Spanish Governor, Diego de Borica, to occupy the very large 113,000 acre land grant which

was officially known as San José de Nuestra Señora de Altagracia y Simí in 1795. During this time, in the early 1800s, the structure called the Simi Adobe was built by the Pico family. The Pico family sold the land grant to

the De la Guerra family c1832.

By the 1870s, the De la Guerras had retreated to Tapo Rancho, a 14,400 acre portion of Rancho Simí. Different individuals inhabited the Simi Adobe throughout the years. In the 1880s the Juareguis, who were Basque sheepherders lived in the Simi Adobe. Right around this time is when the Strathearns appear. On November 14, 1889 Robert P. Strathearn purchased from

the Simi Land and Water Company Tracts J and K, amounting to 13,220 acres. He paid \$33,051. Luckily for

us, Robert P. and Mary Strathearn retained the Simi Adobe, which was on the land rather than razing it, even though it was not in good condition. A new house was then constructed in 1892-93, attached to the remaining rooms of the old adobe. The wood frame farm house residence at the front, which is referred to as the Strathearn house, is Stick Eastlake style, which was popular at the time.



Mr. Strathearn was a cattle rancher, dealing largely in Mexican type cattle, which did well in this climate. Strathearn introduced the first polled Angus cattle to Southern California. This ranch was called the Home Ranch by the Strathearns. The area around what is now Moorpark College was the Middle Ranch.



The Strathearns owned the land and operated the cattle ranch until December 1964, when grandsons of Robert P. Strathearn; David, Robert, Lloyd, Gordon and Bruce sold the ranch. One of the provisions of the sale was that Marion and Isa Strathearn (aunts of the sellers) were granted life tenancy in the house and the nine acres surrounding it.

In 1968 tragedy struck the Strathearn family when David D. L. Strathearn Sr. and two of his five sons, Lloyd and Gordon, perished in a plane crash. That same year Marion, Isa, and Robert "Bert" P. Strathearn Jr. passed away.

In December 1969, the six acre Robert P. Strathearn Historical Park was officially deeded to Simi Valley Recreation and Park District (later changed to Rancho Simi Recreation and Park District). The Simi Valley Historical Society soon entered into an agreement with the Park District to help maintain and manage the Park. And here we are...

about 124 years after the 1892 Strathearn House construction, and over 200 years after the Simi Adobe was built...right here on this site. And we plan to preserve this site for many more generations to enjoy.
