





President's Message

Civil War Days at Strathearn Park Coming SOON! February 20 & 21, 2016 Saturday 10 to 4 & Sunday 10 to 3

Step back with us to another place and time, when General Ulysses S. Grant and his wife could still stroll the streets of our little town, and President Lincoln could take a break from his Washington duties to give a speech on the steps of our Strathearn House! Here, costumed civilians, as well as soldiers from the north and south stand ready in their camps, eager to tell their stories to the passing visitor; sutlers offer for sale civil war era clothing and souvenirs; sergeants drill groups of local boys and girls curious to experience military life; and in the barn across the way, the plunk of a banjo invites the curious to take a lesson in Civil War era dance. Skirmishes, as well as artillery, infantry and cavalry demonstrations will take place throughout the weekend. Food for purchase will be available from Kiwanis Club of Simi Valley and Uncle Chris.

Entrance fees are as follows: \$6 for adults, \$3 for children from 5 to 12, 4 and under free.

It is just amazing how fast a year can go by, and 2015 was no exception to this.



Our restoration team can be proud of their achievements in 2015. We completed the John Deere D tractor, the Model B Farmall tractor, and started work on the Cat 22 Tractor.

Our workshop now has a Logan metal lathe, and a gas welding set up to allow more work to be done in our shop. We may be getting a Milling Machine later this year to provide more in-house fabrications as needed from time to time.

Projects for 2016 include the Cat 22 Tractor and a Model A engine powered portable air compressor. Plans for the Chevy pick-up refurbishment are included for the 2016 project list.

Volunteers are needed, no special skills required just a desire to get involved and lend a hand. We meet each Monday from 9a.m. to noon, in the Strathearn Park Workshop.



In this installment of HISTORY POLICE we will explore the history of a specific ranch in Simi Valley. The ranch that was the Jack Haigh Ranch after the Simi Land and Water Company divided up and sold the land that was El Rancho Simi land grant, and is now primarily the Brandeis-Bardin Campus of the American Jewish University. This is located South of Los Angeles Avenue, accessible by Tapo Canyon, which was known as Peppertree Lane until recently. The Haigh brothers, John

Grenfell and Henry came to the valley of Simi from England in the late 1890s. John "Jack" Haigh purchased

1.825 acres of land in Simi which he used as a stock ranch.

He sold that land to E.R. Maier, the 'Brew 102' man, and owner of the Vernon baseball club. In 1910, the land that Eddie Maier bought from Jack Haigh was called Rancho Potrero Del Burro, to which he added the Cañada Aliso (Sycamore Canyon). Janet Cameron, Simi Historian wrote; "He built a magnificent estate with stables, swimming pools, dancing pavilion, and quarters for the baseball team he sponsored. To this place Mr. Maier brought conventions of Masons and Elks, furnishing barbecues and entertainments. On one occasion when the mem-

bers were to walk the Photo Courtesy of California Historical Society two miles from the train

station to the ranch he had beer kegs along the way which was available for the marchers by simply turning the spigot." In May 1912 the Los Angeles Times reported "At his ranch in Santa Suzanna (sp), Maier was host to about 1800 members of Shriner Patrols and bands on Wednesday....Joe Romero, noted Spanish chef who has presided at all big barbecues for the last 20 years with his sons, Frank and Edward Romero, cooked the feast. They used 4000 lbs of beef, 50 yearling lambs, 40 bulls heads, 500 lbs of chili con carne, 200 Spanish tamales, c1915. Los Angeles Avenue is along the row of trees in the background. 2000 tortillas, 15 sacks of baked potatoes and 15 gallons



of chili sauce." After great fortune, and hosting remarkably lavish parties from 1910 through 1929, Eddie Maier suffered a series of set backs. His ranch was sold off.

In 1947 the Brandeis Institute from New York acquired a site in Simi Valley which was once a portion of the ranch owned by Eddie Maier. They purchased a 2000 acre parcel from Mrs. Maude E. Lane

for a reported sum of \$150,000.



Looking for an investment on the advice of his law firm, James Arness, who portrayed Marshall Matt Dillon on the television show Gunsmoke, in 1959 acquired a 950 acre parcel of land that was another part of the former Maier ranch. Arness raised crops, cattle and horses on his land, which was next to the Brandeis Institute's property. In 1972, Arness donated his 950 acres to the Brandeis Institute. The donated property was said to be worth \$2 million at the time. After Arness donated his 950 acres to the Brandeis institute, the two properties which comprised the area that was formerly the
